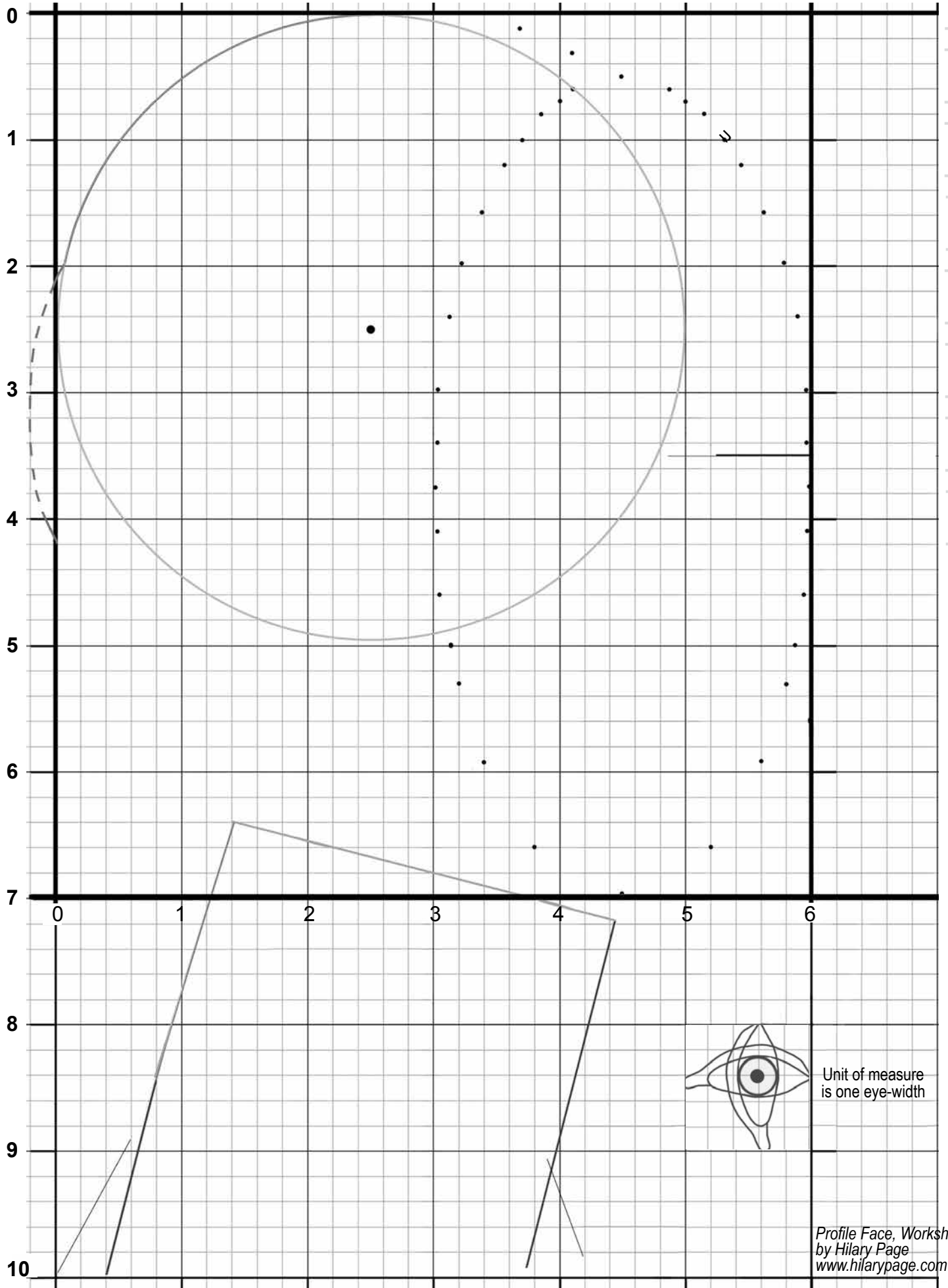


WORKSHEET 1: PROFILE HEAD AND NECK



WORKSHEET 2: FRONTAL HEAD AND NECK

PROCEDURE

1. Print out the profile and frontal head and neck worksheets.

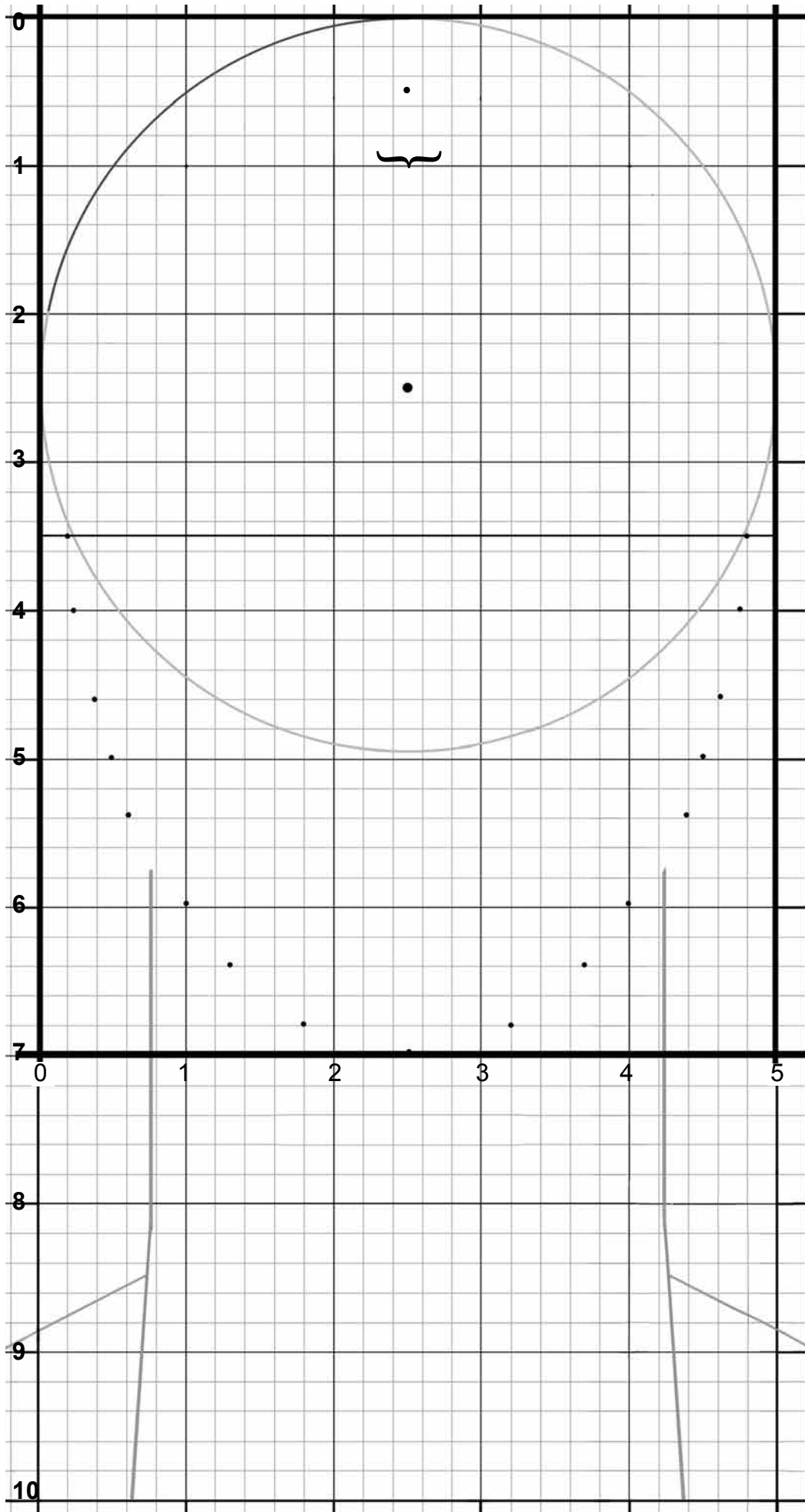
2. Following the gray guide lines and black dots draw in the major shapes of the head and neck. Refer to Step 2 on page 38 in Portraits Right from the Start for directions and illustrations.

3. Using a 3B pencil, lightly lay in the construction marks for placement and size of the features as described in Step 3, page 38. Using the grid as an aid, draw the nose, mouth, chin and back of the profile head (shown by broken lines), and the ears on the frontal head. All extend outside the rectangle.

4. Based on the construction marks, complete a line drawing of the head and neck as per the illustration in Step 4 on page 39.

5. Go over the lines using a fine point black marker. Keep these drawings for reference.

We'll use these worksheets again to make the drawings for the box-head project on pages 52-55.



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
